### **Professional competence**

- draw a setting considering the clients' needs
- strengthen the competence of the client for action
- distinguish diagnoses and to participate (in the team)
- write reports
- cope with situations of conflict and crises
- represent the method in the associated field

### **Social competence**

- understand situations system oriented and to intervene accordingly
- care for a competent handling of institutions, their rules and their personnel

### **Methodological competence**

- work in a professional context with EXA according to Low Skill High Sensitivity
- take up criticism
- develop and enlarge a personal style
- know adequate methods and interventions in coping with the artistic work, the group- or single-setting
- practice positive and solution-oriented communication skills
- recognize and to practice which interventions are helpful to make artistic work and session a success
- be familiar with different clientele
- have practiced "to harvest" and to guide sessions according to EXA
